



2021 Demonstration of Weeding Hoes

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General principles

Hoeing is most effective on hot, dry days with very small weeds – ideally, weeds less than one inch tall. Some of these tools (photos c, g, and h) can't handle anything larger than that. Some have extra-long handles designed to be used with your thumbs pointed upwards, allowing you to stand up straighter for less back strain. When larger weeds are present, the heavier tools are better options.

Save time by covering most of your ground with the largest, fastest tools. Widely-spaced rows with dense in-row spacing can minimize the need for small tools and hand pulling.

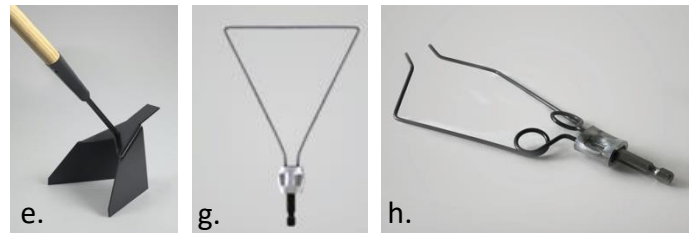
