Over half of the sales are from meat, eggs, and dairy, over a third are from organic crops, and the rest are from livestock sales.

Organic Farming in New York

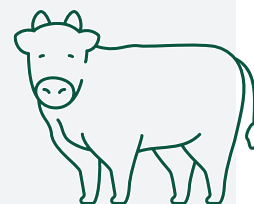
Organic Dairy, Livestock, and Field Crops

New York ranks #1 in the nation for:

- greatest number of farms raising organic cattle
- greatest number of organic sheep
- greatest acreage of organic field crops (corn and soy)
- greatest acreage of organic hay (260,000 acres)
- greatest number of organic dairy operations

New York ranks #3 in the nation for:

- amount of organic milk produced and sold



Organic Specialty Crops

New York is also a top producer of specialty crops, many of which are grown on small diversified operations.

New York ranks #1 in the nation for:

- greatest number of organic mushroom farms

New York ranks #2 in the nation for:

- number of organic maple syrup operations, taps, and sales
- number of organic flower farms

New York ranks #3 in the nation for:

- number of organic apple orchards
- number of organic vegetable farms (top crops include: squash, sweet corn, snap beans, and lettuce)

New York ranks #4 in the nation for:

- number of organic fruit farms (top crops include: blueberries, strawberries, raspberries, and blackberries)

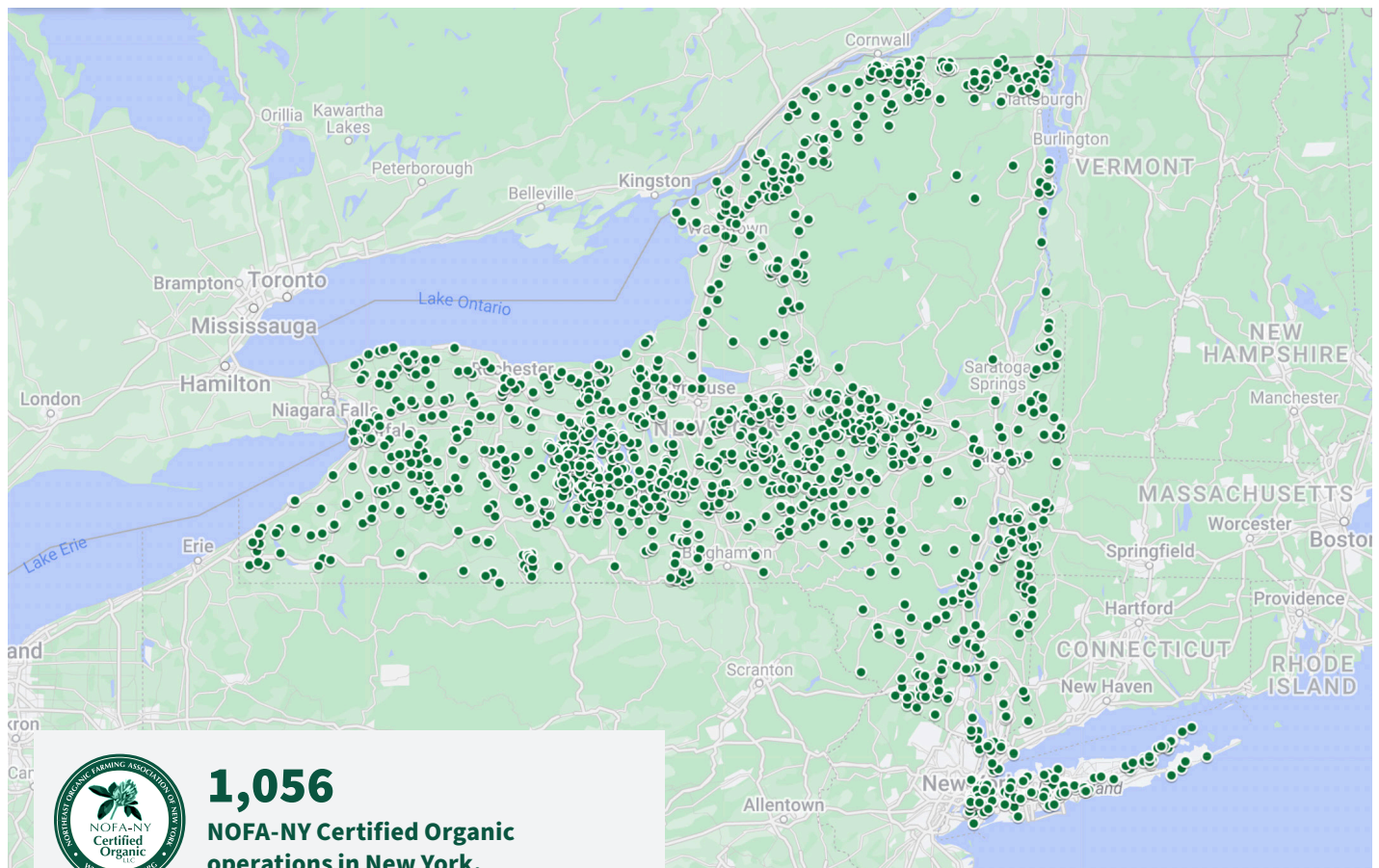
